So, thanks to a session on ebay, a T/F bike in England soon became The fifty-year-old youngster got the racing bug again in 2003 when Brett Stevens toured here with his T/F bound for kiwi soil.

Even when doing a term of service in the navy Athol was living and breathing bikes, he even had bike parts stashed in his cabin. It wasn't just a spare set of spark plugs either,
